I think it makes sense out of school but in school it is unnecessary .




Thank you for reading this far and considering my opinions on this matter and I hope you reconsider and ban phones at school.


Lilly and Max created these theme posters using the app Wordfoto. They had to summarise the theme and symbolism of the books they have read this term about Australians at War.
