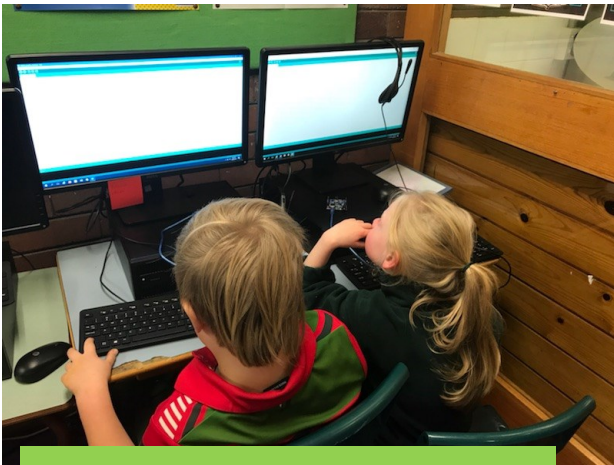

How To Make A Bee Hotel.

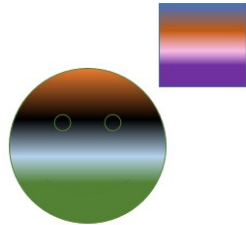
Materials:

3rd Put some wire on the back.

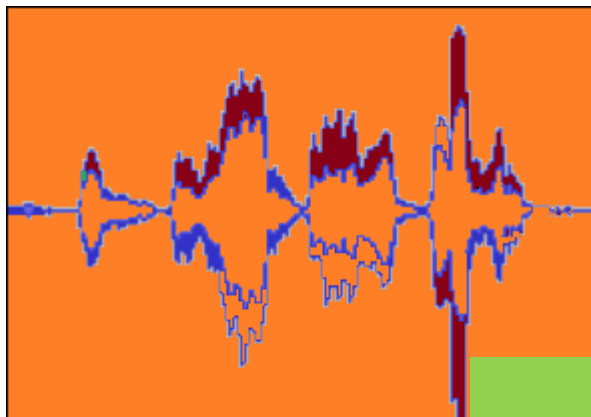
4th Put the bee hotel near some bee friendly flowers.
